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1. SCOPE AND INTENT

The Equipment Services Division of the Washoe County Public Works Department is seeking to establish an agreement for delivery of Equipment Services' Safety Inspection and Lube Service as is described on the PM-A checklist provided in attachment A on certain designated fleet vehicles. The requested unit's service should conform to the technical specifications provided [#24 SPECIFICATIONS], and be suitable for continuous use by the Equipment Services Division.

- 1.1. Washoe County reserves the right to add vehicles as needed to the Safety Inspection and Lube Services agreement with the successful proposer through June 30, 2009 provided there is no increase in pricing.
- 1.2. Washoe County requires that services listed on the PM-A service checklist [#24 SPECIFICATIONS] will be completed only by ASE Certified Technicians with current ASE certification in brakes, steering and suspension.
- 1.3. Washoe County is required to use recycled oil, therefore the engine oil must be Inter-State Ultra motor oil or a County approved equal. (see attachment B for oil specifications and Material Safety Data Sheet)
- 1.4. Washoe County reserves the right to inspect the maintenance facility of all bidders to verify that it has the necessary capacity, safety equipment, certified lifts, etc. to perform the service being requested.

2. BID RECEIPT AND OPENING TIME

It is mandatory that bids be signed by a duly authorized representative of the firm, and be received and time-stamped in the Washoe County Purchasing Department not later than 2:00 p.m., Wednesday, June 18, 2008.

- 2.1. Late bids shall be disqualified from consideration.
- 2.2. Sealed bids shall be opened in the Washoe County Purchasing Department at 2:15 p.m. Wednesday, June 18, 2008.

3. PREPARATION OF BID

Bidder shall examine all drawings, specifications, attachments, special instructions, and terms and conditions of the bid. Failure to do so will be at the bidder's risk.

- 3.1. Any irregularities or lack of clarity in the bid should be brought to the attention of the Washoe County Purchasing Department for correction or clarification.
- 3.2. Any addenda issued shall forthwith become an integral part of the bid. Bidder shall be required to acknowledge receipt of same by signing and returning the addenda with the original bid document.
- 3.3. Bidder shall furnish the required information typed or written in ink.
- 3.4. Erasures or other changes must be initialed in ink by the person signing the bid.
- 3.5. In the space provided on the bid schedule, a duly authorized representative of the proposing firm shall sign the bid document.
- 3.6. Bidder shall proofread his bid carefully for errors.
- 3.7. In the event of a difference between written words and figures, the amount stated in written words shall govern.
- 3.8. In the event of a difference between a unit price and the extended price, the unit price shall govern.
- 3.9. All equipment or supplies offered shall be new, currently in production, and of the manufacturer's latest design. No used or refurbished equipment will be accepted.
- 3.10. Technical specifications contained herein shall be considered as minimum requirements. Should the manufacturer's current published data or specifications exceed these, they shall be considered minimum and be furnished by the bidder. A bidder deviating from the specifications must specify any and all exceptions. Failure to note exceptions shall be interpreted to convey that the proposer will perform in the manner described and/or specified in this bid solicitation.
- 3.11. Alternate bid proposals shall be considered provided said alternative(s) are fully described and accompanied by brochures, literature, specifications or a combination thereof. Washoe County's decision with respect to equality shall be final.

4. **SUBMISSION OF BID**

Proposer shall sign and return the **ENTIRE BID DOCUMENT**.

- 4.1. Bid's and addenda thereto shall be enclosed in a sealed envelope addressed to the Washoe County Purchasing Department, 1001 E. Ninth Street, Building C Room C-200, Reno, Nevada 89512-2845. Bid envelope must indicate name and address of bidder, Bid number, and opening date.
- 4.2. In order for a bid to be considered it shall be mandatory that the bid document be received and time-stamped in the Washoe County Purchasing Department no later than the receiving time specified in the bid document.

- 4.3. Washoe County assumes no responsibility for errant delivery of bids, including those relegated to a courier agent who fails to deliver in accordance with the time and receiving point specified.
- 4.4. Washoe County shall not be responsible for the premature opening of a bid that is not properly addressed or identified.
- 4.5. A bid submitted by telephone, telegraphic notice, or facsimile will not be accepted.
- 4.6. Prices offered shall <u>only</u> be considered if they are provided in the appropriate space(s) on the bid schedule. For consideration, any additions or deductions to the bid prices offered must be shown under the exceptions section of the bid. Extraneous numbers, prices, comments etc., appearing elsewhere on the bid shall be deemed to have no effect on the prices offered in the designated locations.
- 4.7. When a bid surety is required, such surety shall be acceptable only in the form of a bid bond, certified check, or cashier's check in the amount stated. The surety must accompany the bid. After award of bid by the Board of County Commissioners, the bid surety of the unsuccessful bid shall be returned. The surety of the successful bidder shall be retained until satisfactory performance has been rendered.
- 4.8. Washoe County shall provide a copy of the bid results to those proposers requesting such, provided that a stamped, self-addressed envelope is included with the bidder's response.

5. LATE BID

A bid received after the receiving time specified shall be rejected.

5.1. BIDDERS NOTE THAT THE RECEIVING TIME IS <u>DIFFERENT</u> FROM THE OPENING TIME.

6. <u>WITHDRAWAL OF BID</u>

A bid may be withdrawn by written or telegraphic notice, provided such notice is received prior to the date and time set for the bid opening.

6.1. A request for withdrawal of a bid received after the scheduled bid opening will not be considered.

7. NO BID

In the event the bidder chooses not to bid on the Invitation, indicate "NO BID" on the face of the return envelope or Bid Schedule Page of the bid document, affix firm name and address and return it according to the instructions in section 4, "Submission of Bid," above.

8. <u>DISCOUNTS</u>

Prompt payment discounts shall be included in bid evaluation ONLY if discount period offered is twenty (20) or more days.

8.1 Discount period will be computed from the date of completed delivery/performance or from the date the correct invoice is received by Comptroller, if later than the delivery date. For the purpose of earning discounts, payment is deemed to be made on the date on the County warrant

9. <u>TAX EXEMPTION</u>

Washoe County is exempt from Nevada State Sales Tax by act of the Nevada State Legislature, NRS 372.325, which exempts all local governments within the State of Nevada. Washoe County is also exempt from Federal Excise Tax. Washoe County's exemption certificate number is 88730007K, under Chapter 32 of the Internal Revenue Code.

10. AWARD OF BID

Award of bid shall be made on the basis of the bid that is most advantageous to Washoe County. In all instances, the decision rendered by the Board of County Commissioners shall be final.

- 10.1. Washoe County reserves the right to reject any or all bids per NRS 332.075, and to waive any informalities or irregularities.
- 10.2. Washoe County reserves the right to hold bids for a period of ninety (90) days from date of opening before awarding or rejecting said bids.
- 10.3. Severability exists with regard to acceptance or rejection of any item, group of items, or section unless bidder has stipulated specific limitations.
- 10.4. A purchase order and/or contract issued to the successful bidder shall be considered sufficient notification of the award of bid.
- 10.5. It is understood that the successful proposer shall consider this bid an open end contract for all items offered. In the event the Washoe County Equipment Service requires additional items or replacement items, it is understood that the successful bidder agrees to furnish items as per the terms of this bid from the date of award through the completion of this contract.
- 10.6. Fiscal Funding Out Clause: Washoe County reasonably believes that funds can be obtained sufficiently to make all payments during the term of this contract.

However, if sufficient funds are not allocated to continue the renting or purchasing of the products and/or service, this contract may be terminated when appropriated funds expire.

10.7. The resulting agreement with the successful proposer shall not be assigned to any other person or entity without the consent of Washoe County. Requests for assignment shall be submitted, in writing, to the Purchasing and Contracts Administrator.

11. <u>JOINDER PROVISION</u>

In accordance with the provisions of NRS 332.195, certain other public entities may participate in this joinder procedure for equipment as described herein.

- 11.1. Each participating entity shall execute agreements for the required service in accordance with the procedures of the Accounting and Purchasing Departments of the public entities involved.
- 11.2. Within the scope of this Invitation to BID, Washoe County shall be held harmless in any and all transactions between the bidder and the other participating governmental entities.
- 11.3. The bidder shall acknowledge the joinder process and shall acknowledge Washoe County as the situs of the bid procedure.

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12. <u>BID PREPARATION/RESPONSE</u>

Bidder shall sign and return all pages of this bid. Pricing offered shall include all delivery and installation charges and shall be exclusive of Federal, State and local government taxes.

12.1. Detailed specifications and/or product literature shall be submitted in duplicate with bid response.

13. <u>DELIVERY</u>

In space provided on bid schedule, proposers shall indicate the total delivery time for all services required after receipt of vehicle, not to exceed 90 minutes (not inclusive of any approved additional items as defined in section 13.2). Successful bidder shall be expected to adhere to delivery time stated, to maintain status with the County as a responsible bidder

13.1. The successful bidder will be responsible for completion of all inspections per the supplied Washoe County PM-A checklist and installation of engine oil

filter and engine oil per the vehicle manufacturer's specification. This will include the removal of all residual fluids or other materials and disposal in accordance with all applicable requirements.

- 13.2. Replacement of non-safety related parts will not be performed without written approval by an authorized representative of Equipment Services. Contact information will be provided to the successful bidder.
- 13.3. The County reserves the right to inspect any replaced part upon request and to be informed of the manufacturer's make and model of the part/parts being replaced to insure compliance with County standards. If the inspected part does not meet the County's criteria for replacement, the County will not be responsible for the cost of the new part.
- 13.4. Each vehicle scheduled for service will be assigned a work order number issued by Equipment Services. This number must be referenced on all service provider's documentation, including all invoices and statements. Upon completion of each service, the provider will fax a copy of their completed work order to the authorized representative of Equipment Services.
- 13.5. Should the services be improperly or unsatisfactorily performed, the successful proposer shall provide the services again and as required, at the successful proposer's sole expense.
- 13.6. In the event that the successful bidder fails to deliver the product and/or service in accordance with the terms and conditions of the bid, Washoe County shall have the option to either terminate the contract or temporarily procure the product and/or service from another supplier. If the product and/or service are procured from another supplier, the successful bidder shall pay Washoe County any difference between the bid price and the price paid to the other supplier.
- 13.7. The successful bidder shall replace, at their expense, damaged or defective parts or service within fourteen (14) calendar days after notice. This shall include any associated costs. Failure to do so will cause such service to be procured from another supplier. If the service is procured from another supplier, the successful bidder shall pay the Washoe County any difference between the bid price and the price paid to the other supplier.
- 13.8. Delivery time for the service shall be a consideration in the bid evaluation and recommendation for award process

14. WARRANTY REQUIREMENTS

In the space provided on the bid schedule, bidders shall indicate the nature and duration of the warranty on the service offered.

14.1. At time of delivery of bid, successful bidder shall deliver written warranties to:

15. <u>IMPLIED WARRANTIES</u>

All implied warranties of merchantability and "fitness for a particular purpose" shall survive the warranty period.

16. EXCEPTIONS TO SPECIFICATIONS

In the space provided in Section 28 bidders shall note whether they comply or take exception to any of the specifications. In addition, in the space provided on the bid schedule, bidders shall indicate any exceptions with the terms and conditions of the bid, and may clarify any exceptions taken with bid specifications. Please identify specification number or bid section for which exceptions are taken. Submittal of a specification sheet alone shall not be considered sufficient notification of exceptions.

- 16.1. Failure to note compliance or exception in the spaces provided in Section 28 and on the BID Schedule if related to other terms and conditions of bid shall be evidence of the bidder's intent to perform in the manner described and/or specified in this bid.
- 16.2. Washoe County reserves the right to accept or reject any or all alternatives or exceptions offered, based solely on the value of said alternatives or exceptions to Washoe County.

17. <u>BID EVALUATION</u>

BID evaluation shall be based on the following factors; but other factors shall be considered if need shall arise during the evaluation process:

- 17.1. Ability to meet specifications;
- 17.2. Cost of Service as specified;
- 17.3. Maintenance capability and costs;

17.4. Warranty offered; and

17.5. Delivery schedule.

18. PROTEST OF SPECIFICATIONS OR CONTRACT TERMS

A bidder who believes bid specifications are unnecessarily restrictive or limit competition may submit a protest, in writing to the Washoe County Purchasing Department.

If time allows, the Purchasing Department will promptly respond in writing to each written protest, and where appropriate, issue all revisions, substitutions, or clarifications via addenda. Protests of technical or contractual requirements shall include the reason for the protest, supported by documented factual information, and any proposed changes to the requirements.

19. <u>DISCLOSURE OF PRINCIPALS</u>

Bidders shall complete and return with their bid response, the single copy of the form entitled "Disclosure of Principals" located in Section 29 of this Invitation to Bid.

20. OPEN MEETING LAW

NRS 241 provides that public business shall be conducted in open meeting. The office of the Washoe County District Attorney shall defend challenges to any resultant award.

21. DEFAULT

In case of default by the successful bidder, Washoe County may purchase the Service from another source and hold the defaulting bidder responsible for any excess cost occasioned thereby, assess a penalty equal to five (5) percent of the total bid price, commence with proceedings against any surety and/or performance bond held in conjunction with the bid, debar the bidder for a period of not less than one (1) year or more than five (5) years, and/or pursue other applicable legal remedies.

22. APPEAL BY UNSUCCESSFUL BIDDER

Any unsuccessful bidder may appeal a pending bid award prior to award by Washoe County. The appellant must:

- 22.1. Submit a written protest to the Purchasing and Contracts Administrator within five workdays after the bid recommendation for award has been posted to www.demandstar.com.
- 22.2. Describe, in the written protest, the issues to be addressed on appeal.
- 22.3. Post, with the written protest, a bond with good and solvent surety authorized to do business in this state or submit other security in a form approved by Washoe County, who will hold the bond or other security until a determination is made on the appeal.
- 22.4. Post the bond or other security in the amount of 25% of the total dollar value of appellant's bid, up to a maximum bond or other security amount of \$250,000.
- 22.5. Not seek any type of judicial intervention until Washoe County has rendered its final decision on the protest.
- 22.6. Washoe County will stay any award actions until after the Purchasing and Contracts Administrator has responded in writing to the protest. If the appellant is not satisfied with the response, appellant may then protest to the Washoe County Board of Commissioners, who will render a final decision for the County. No bid protests will be heard by the Board of Commissioners unless the bidder has followed the appeal process.
- 22.7. If an appeal is granted, the full amount of the posted bond will be returned to the appellant. If the appeal is denied or not upheld, a claim may be made against the bond for expenses suffered by the County because of the unsuccessful appeal.
- 22.8. Washoe County is not liable for any costs, expenses, attorney's fees, and loss of income or other damages sustained by the appellant in a bid process.

23. DESCRIPTIVE LITERATURE

All bids shall be submitted with two (2) copies of manufacturer's current literature and/or drawings and specifications for the services requested.
