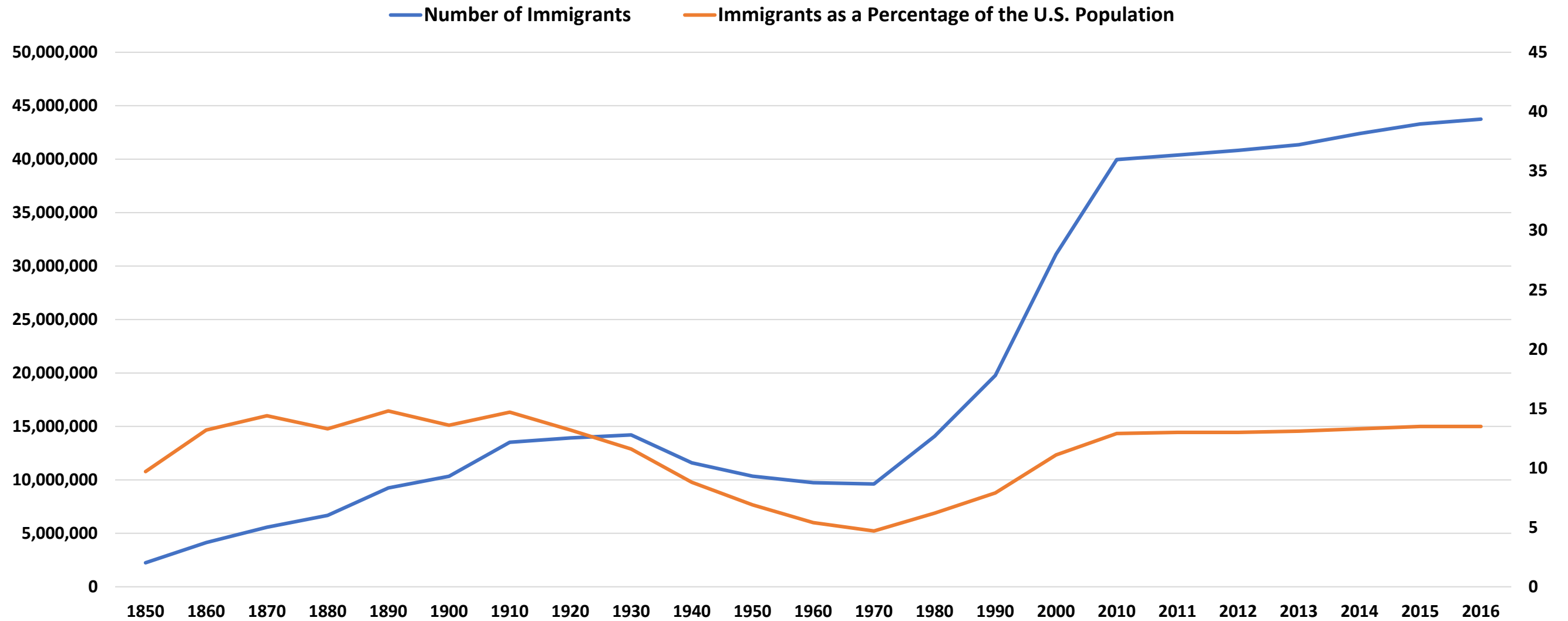

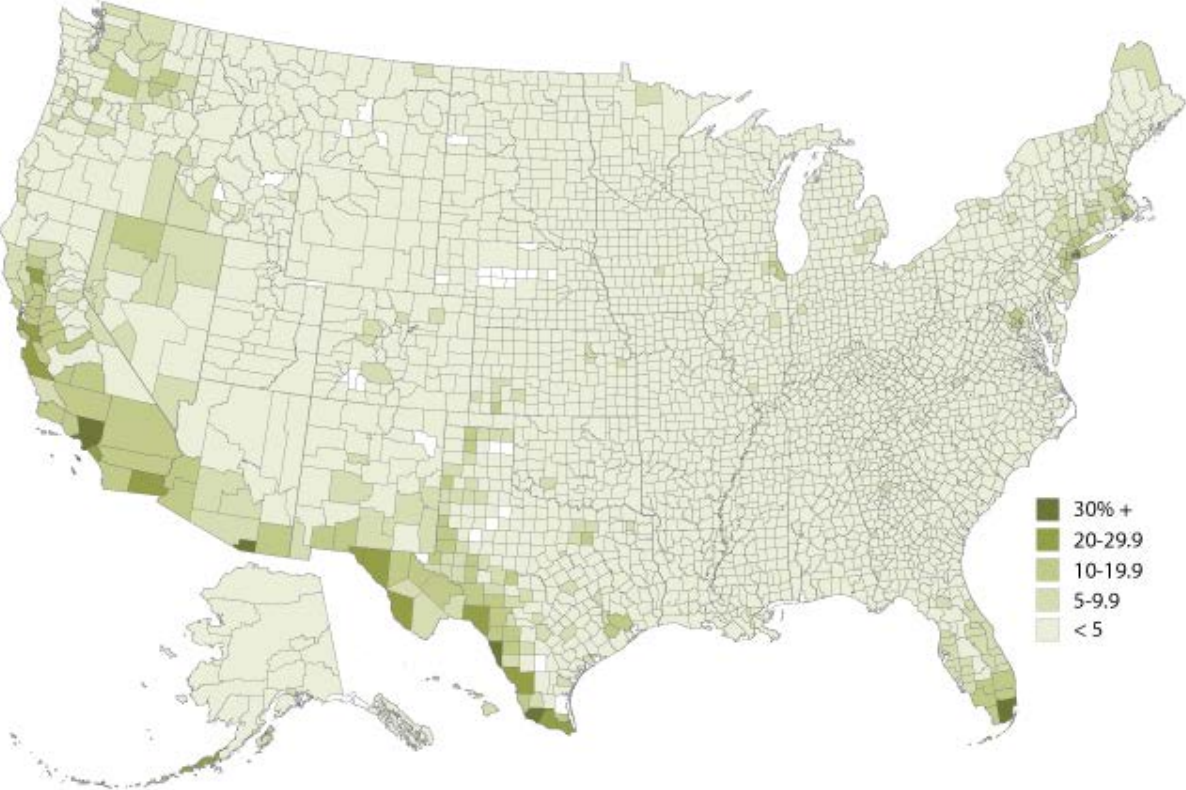
Number of Immigrants and Immigrants as Percentage of the U.S. Population, 1850-2016

Percent foreign-born, by county, 1990

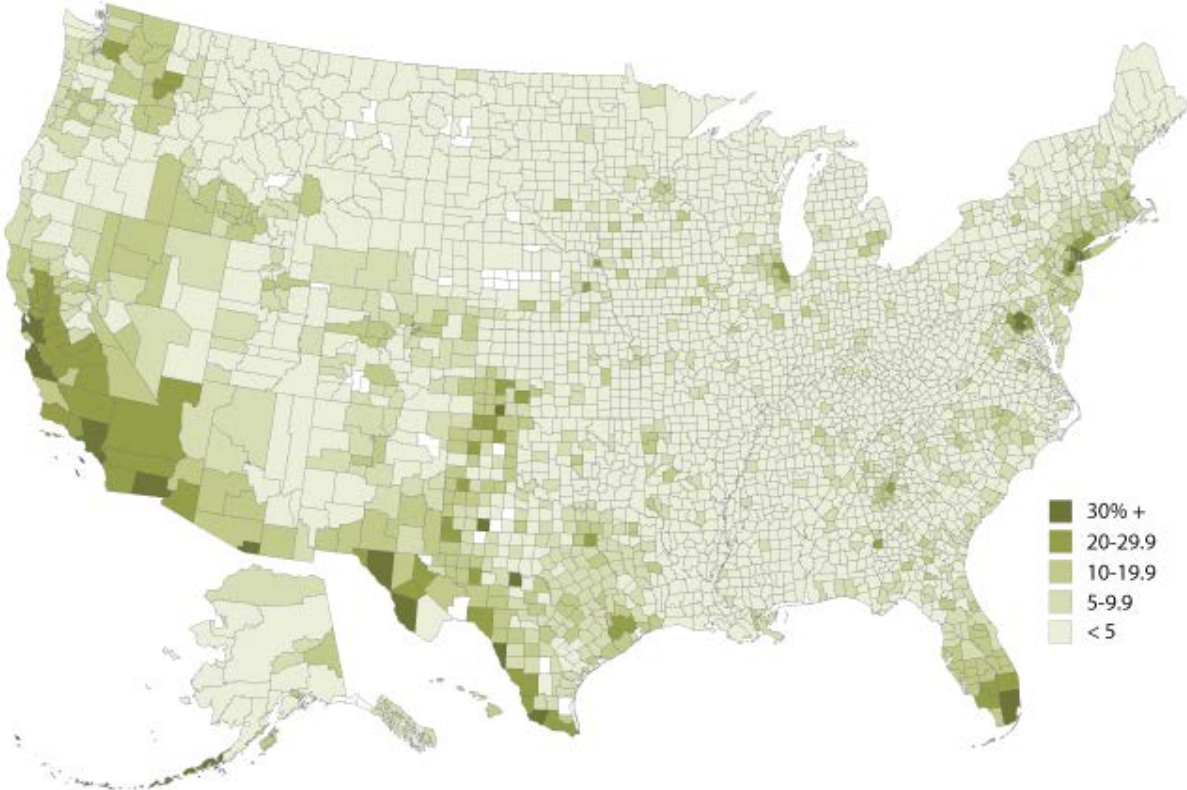

Percent foreign-born, by county, 2011-2015

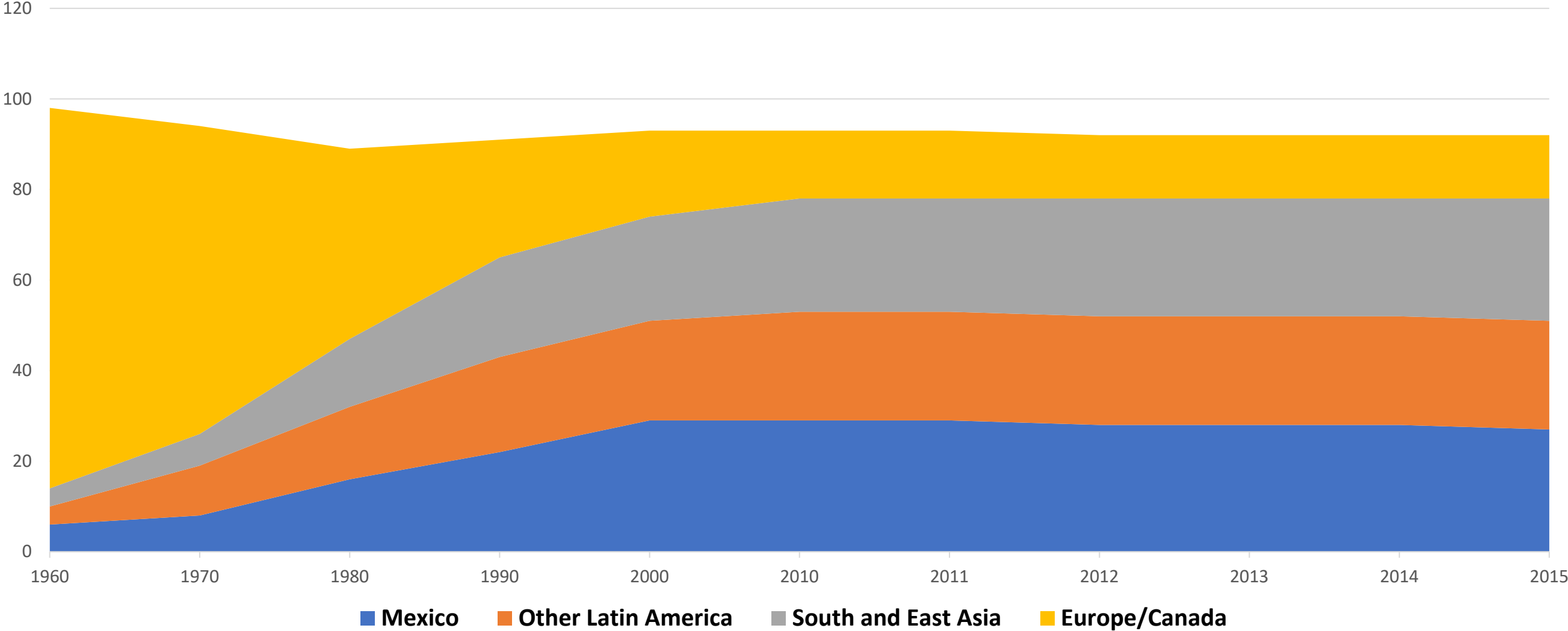

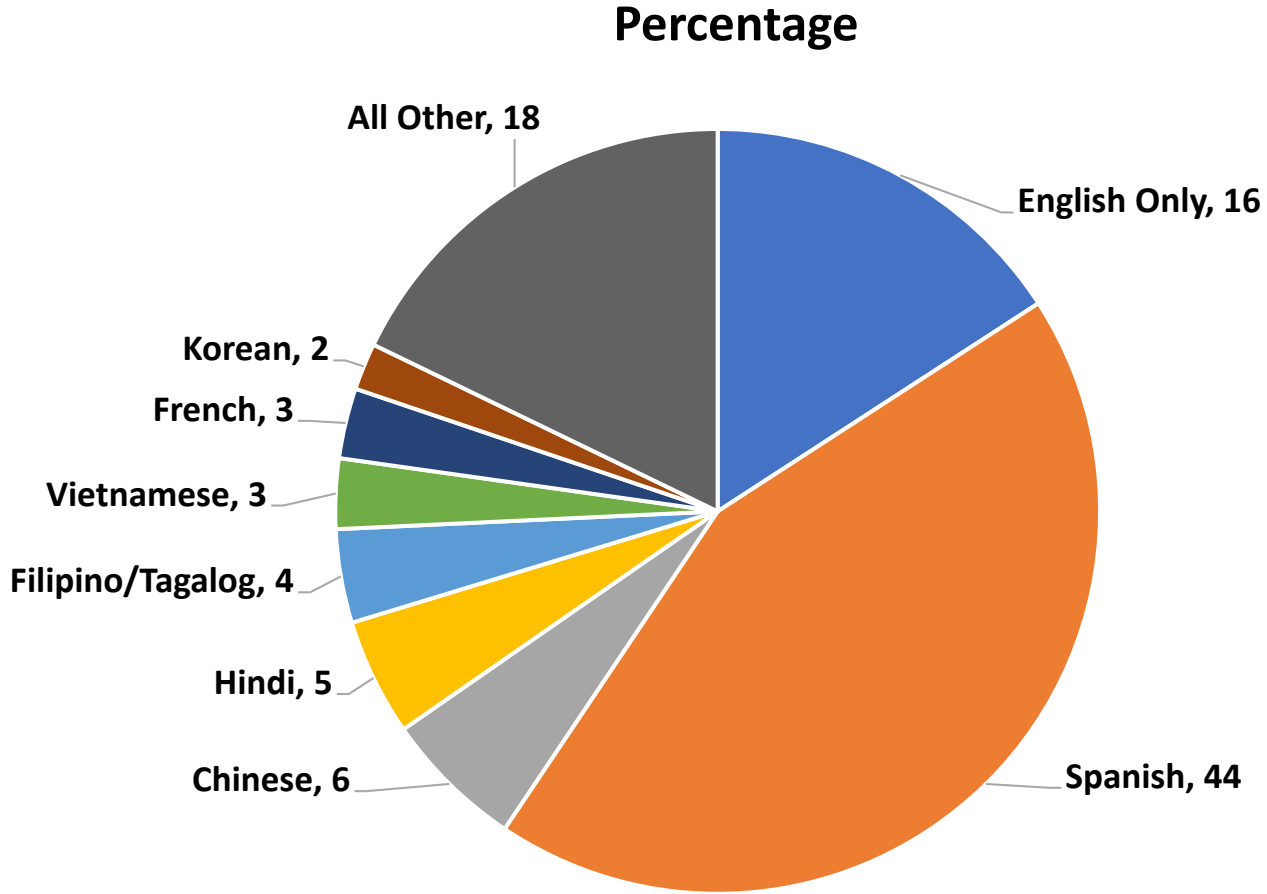

Origins of the U.S. Immigrant Population, 1960-2015



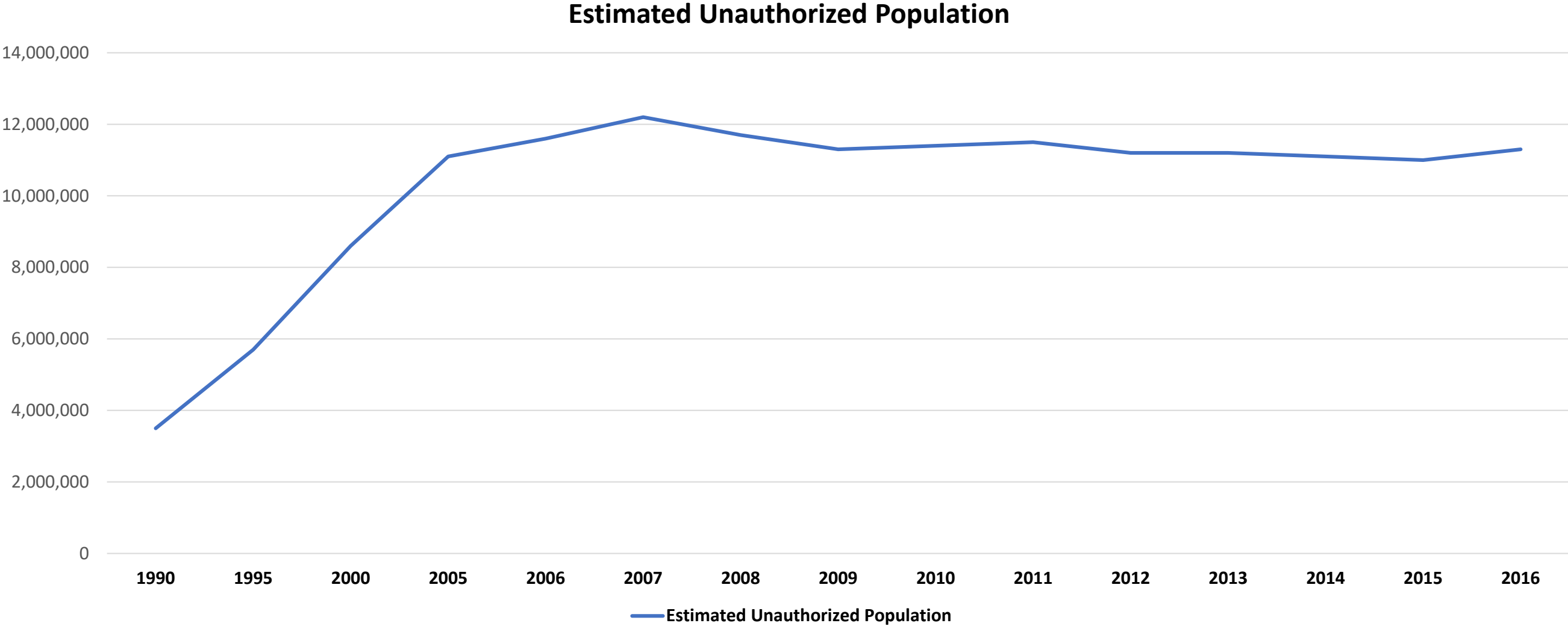

Estimated Unauthorized Immigrant Population in the U.S., 1990-2016

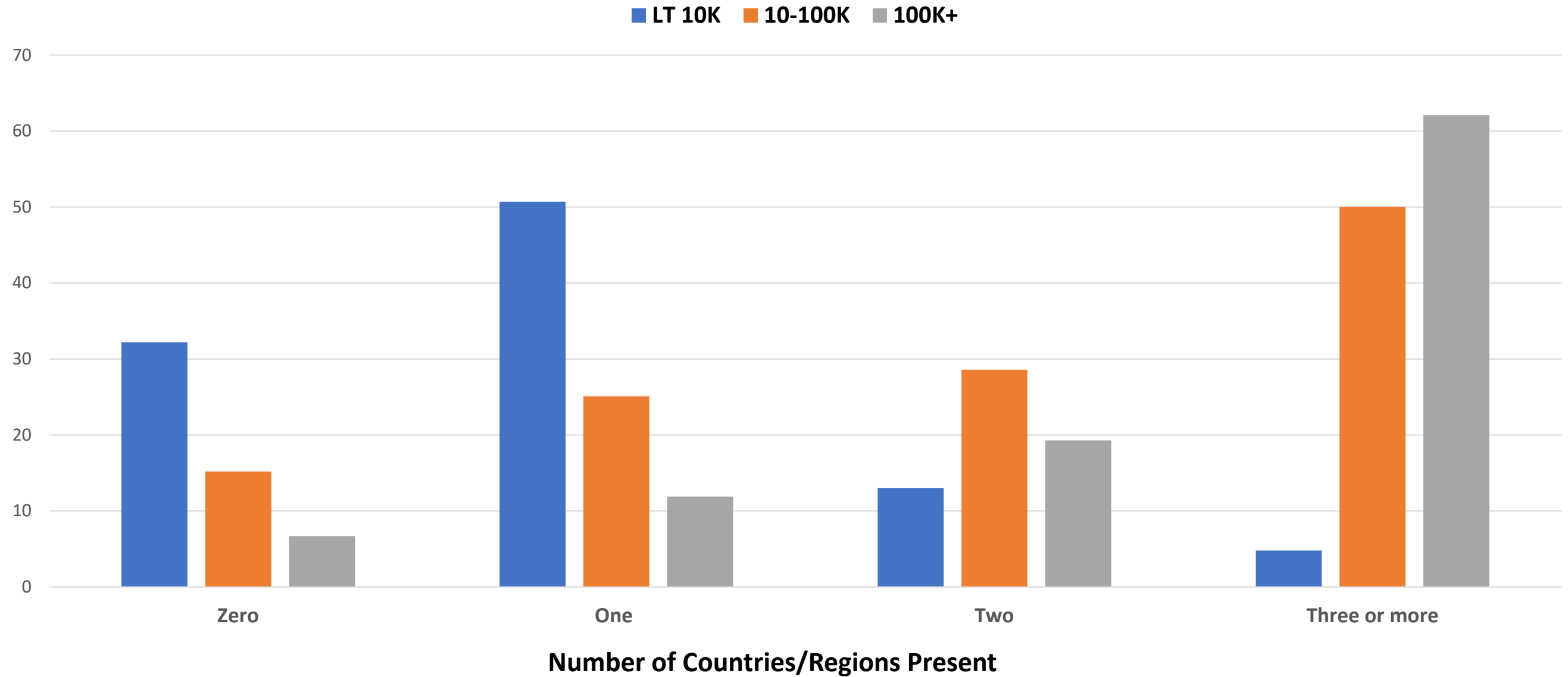

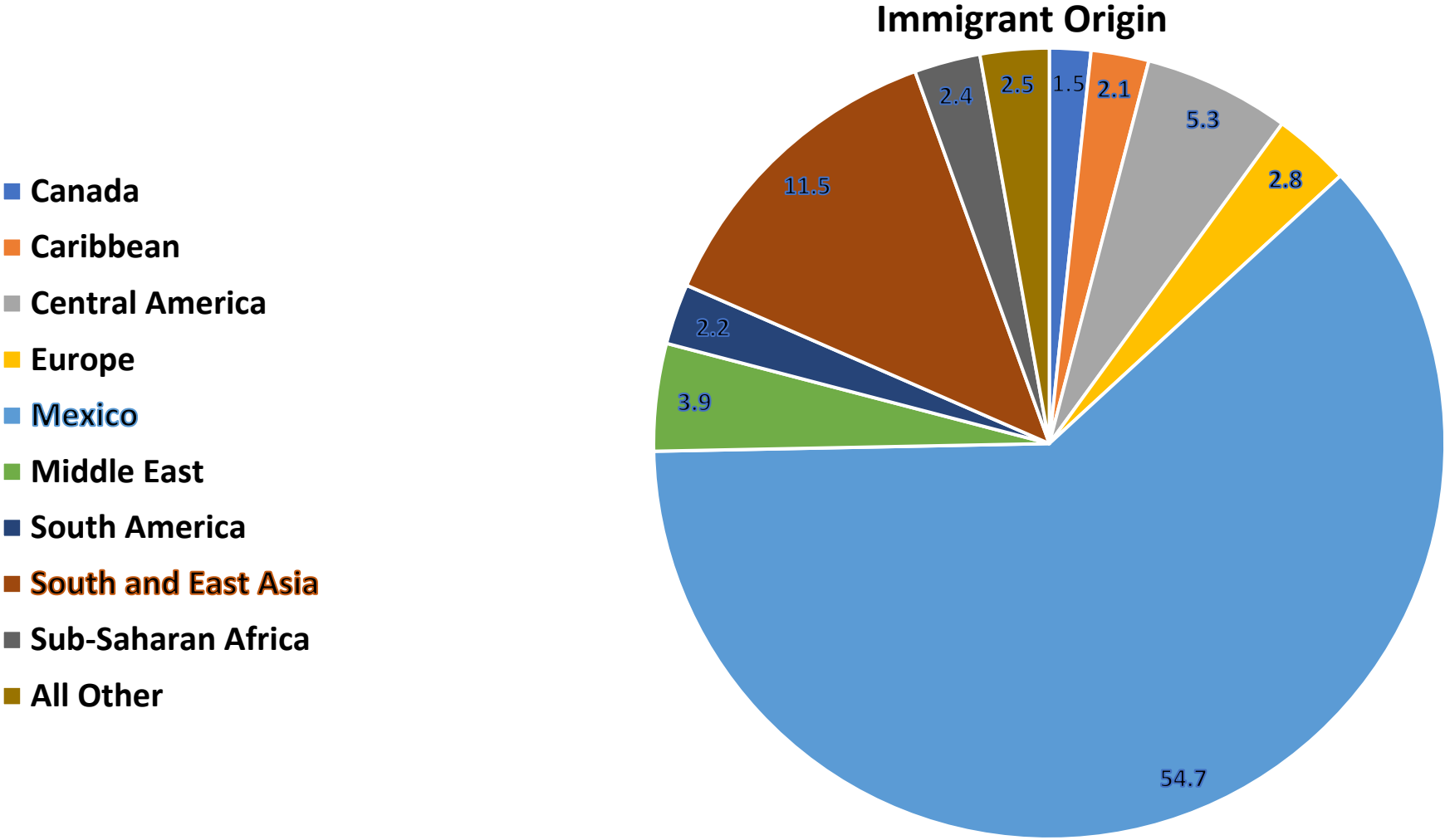


Number of Immigrant Countries/Regions Present by Population Size

Largest Share of Community Immigrant Population by Nation or Region of Origin



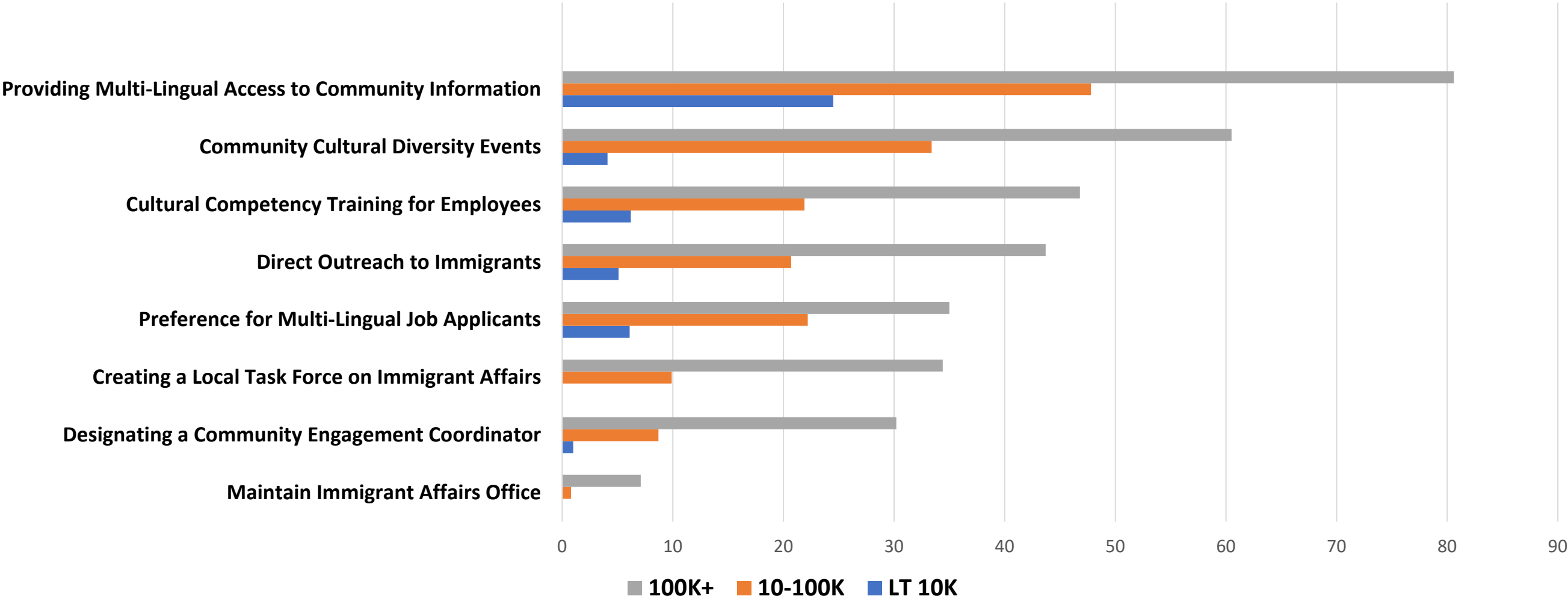

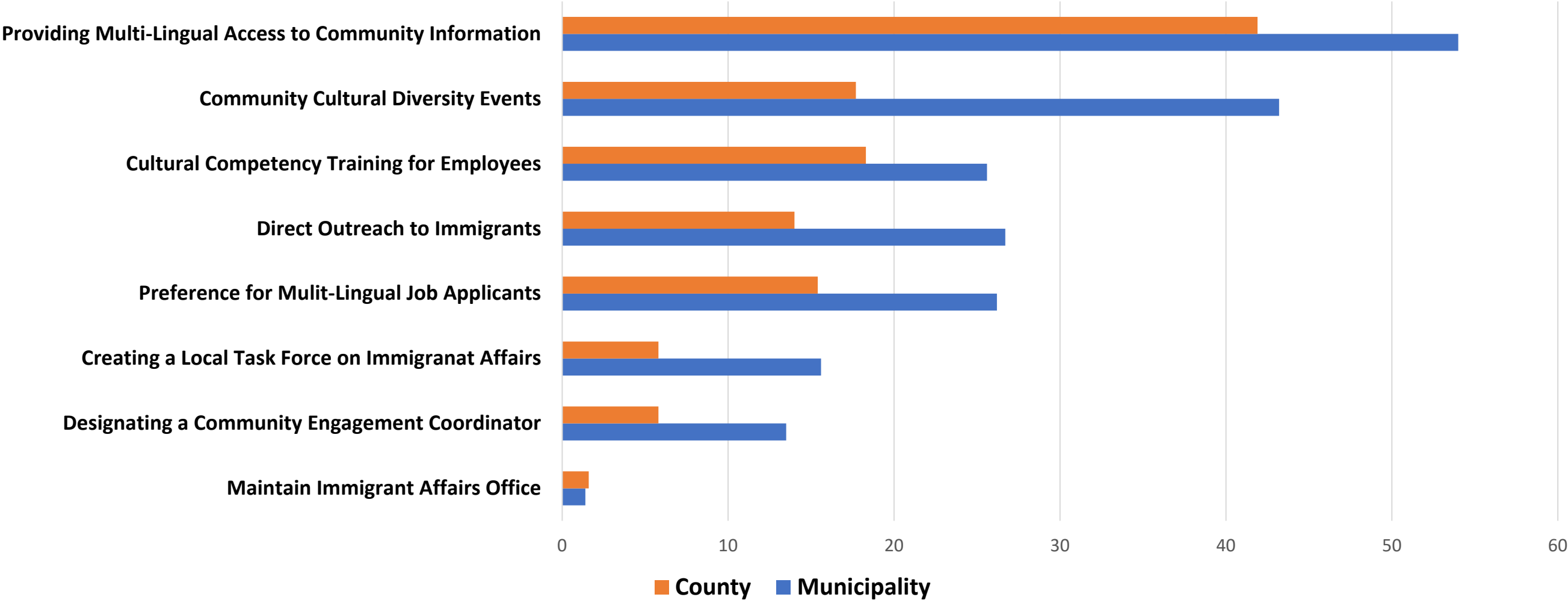

Immigrant Engagement and Integration Activities by County/Municipality

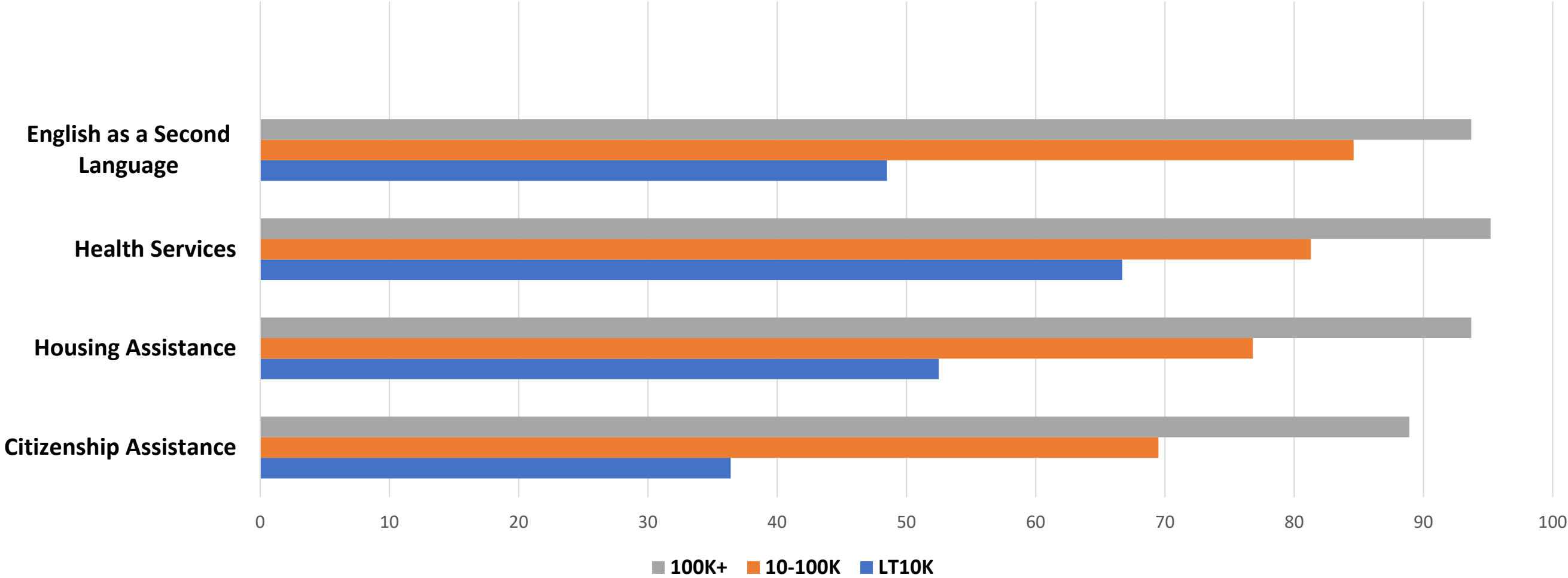

Available Services for Immigrants by Population Size

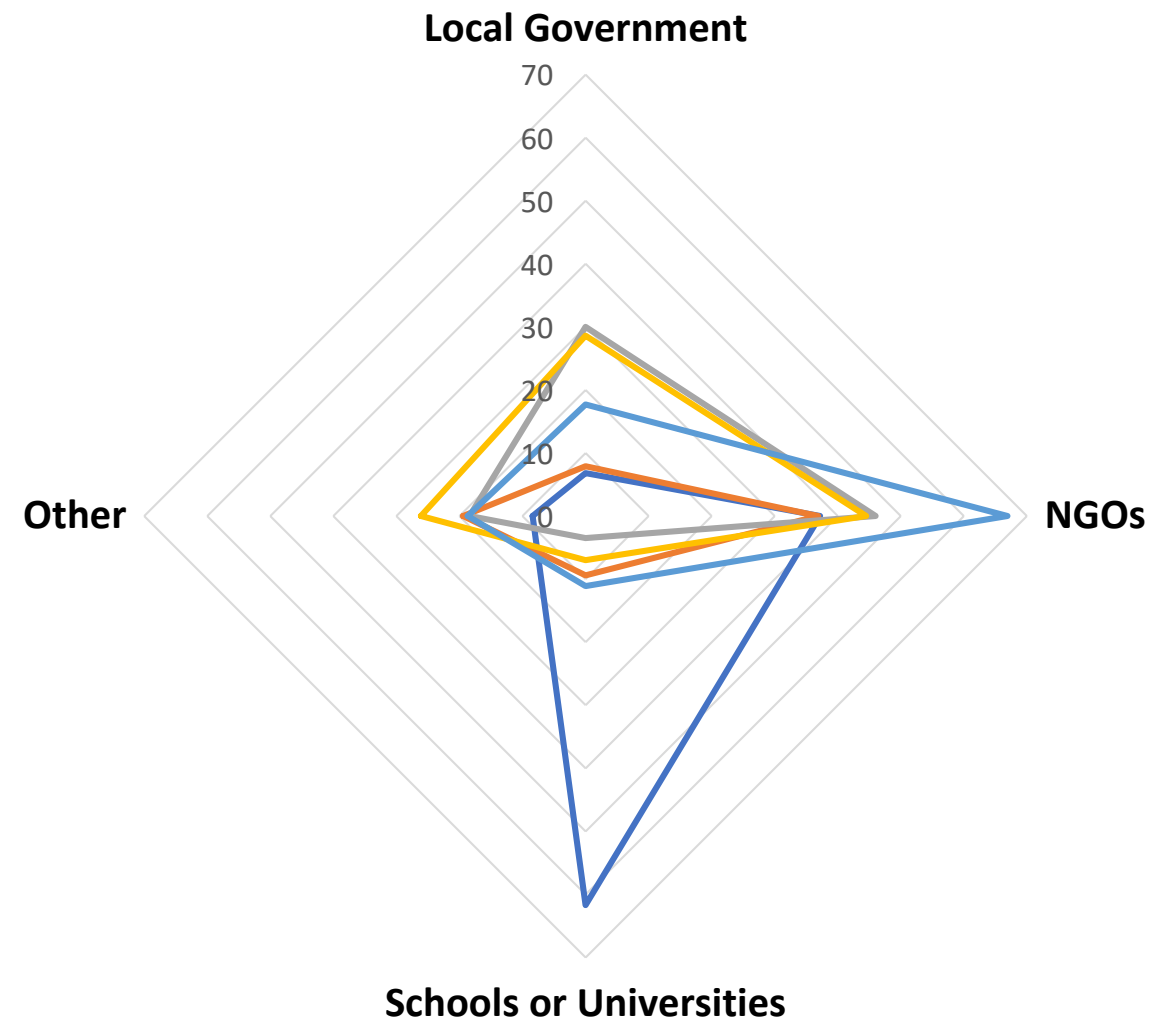
Percentage with Available Services

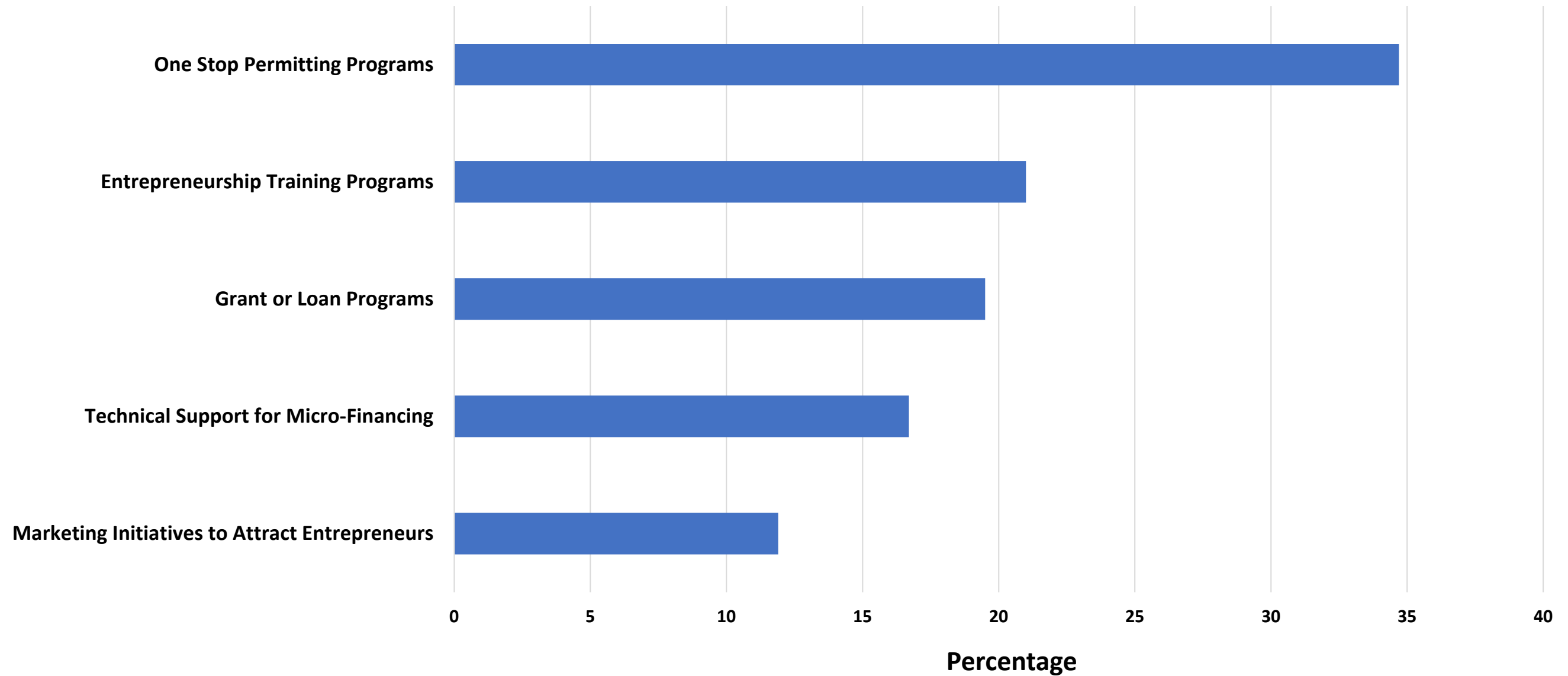

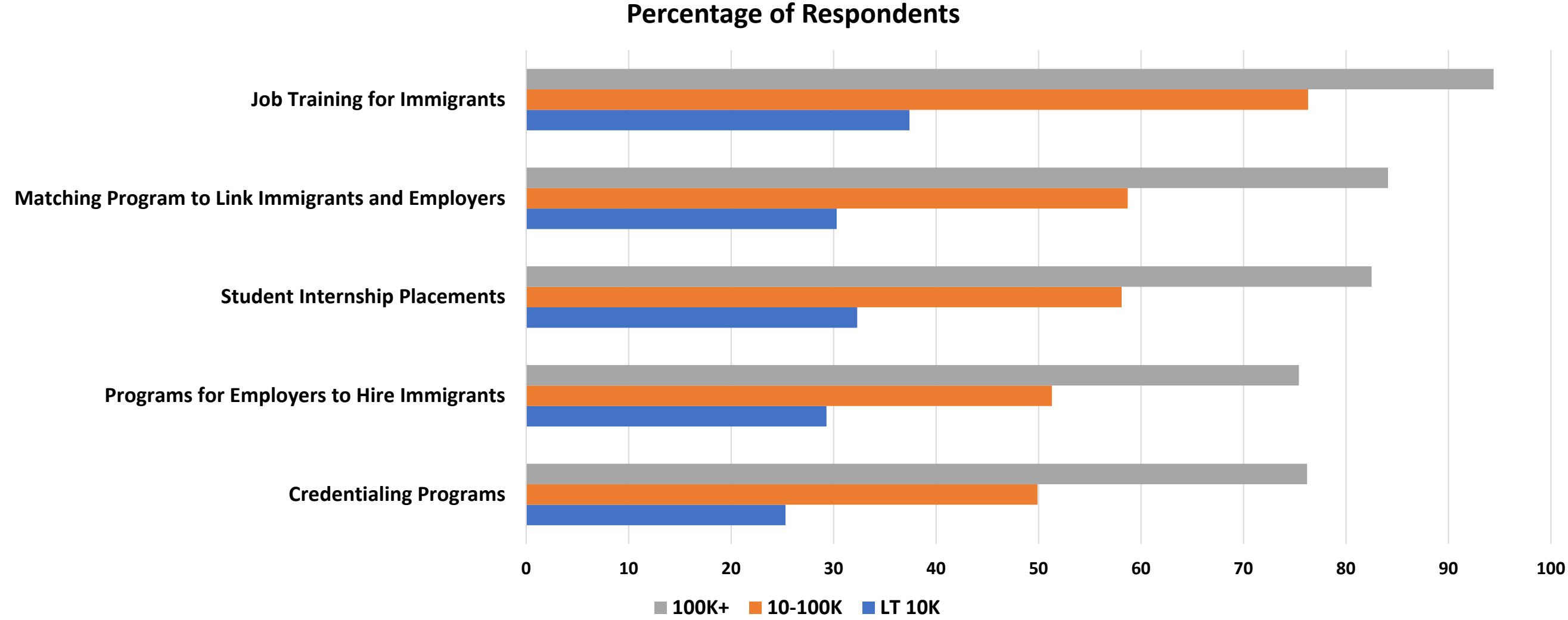

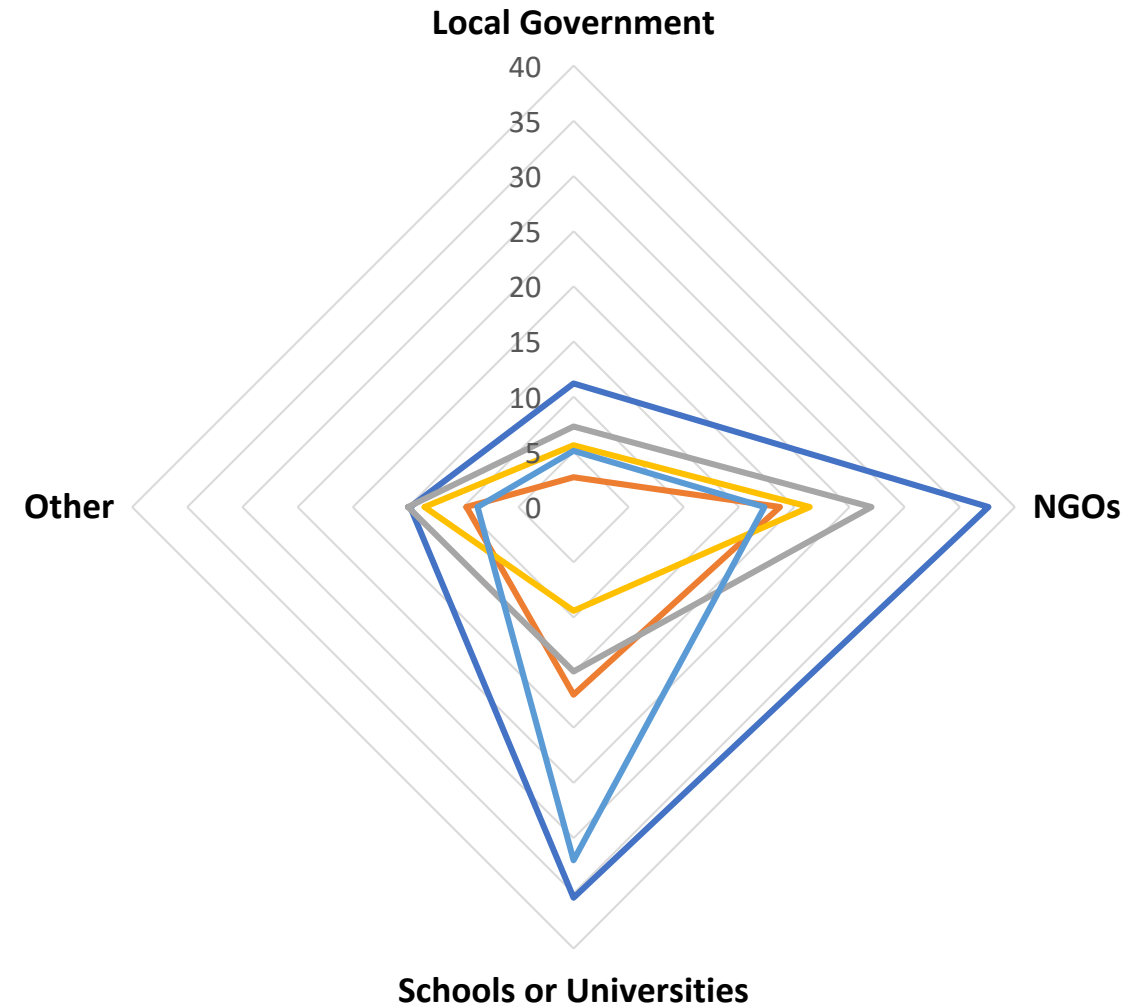
Availability of Support for Immigrant Employment by Population Size

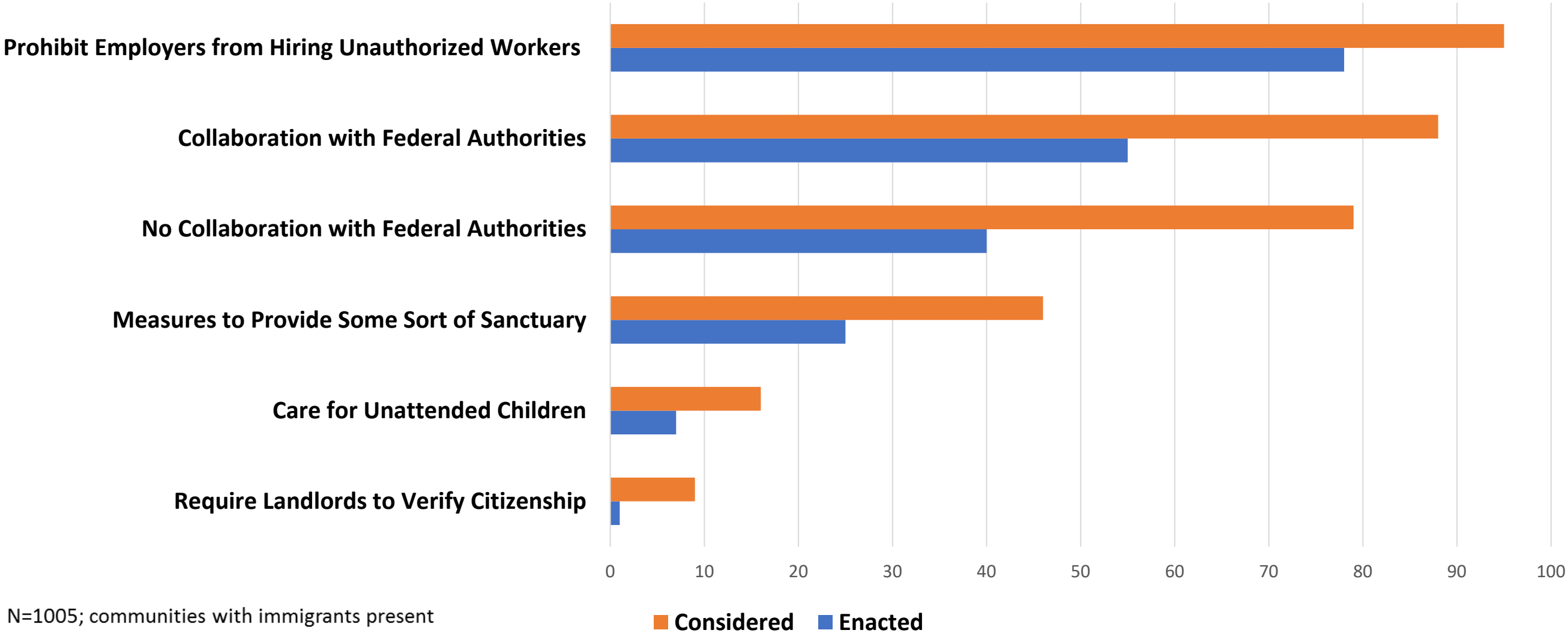
