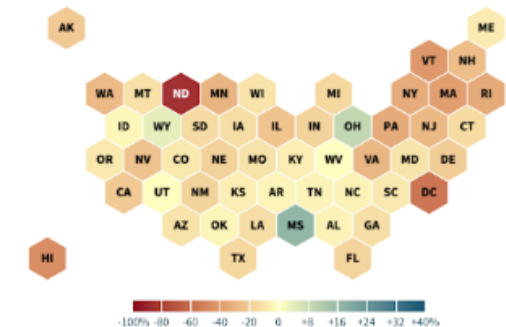

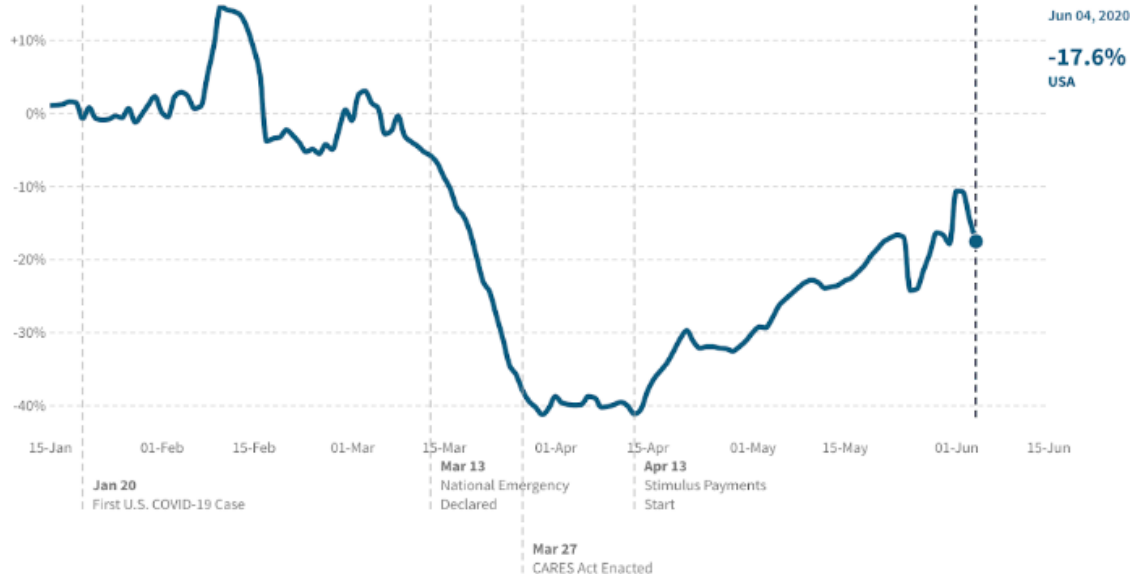
Shutdown Impact on Small Businesses

In the United States, as of June 04 2020, total small business revenue decreased by 17.6% compared to January 2020.



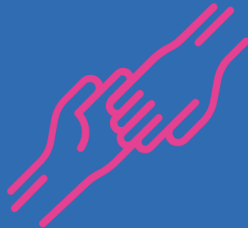

 - Ease of use
 - Auto communications/reminders
 - Application status
- Stronger Decisioning
 - Automatic assignments
 - Pre-configured data views/pulls
 - Eligibility quizzes

- Simplified Reporting
 - Easy data exports
 - Set KPIs
 - Sharable dashboards/charts
