The *Police and Fire Personnel, Salaries, and Expenditures* surveys were mailed in the winter/spring of 2004 to all municipalities with populations 10,000 and over. Of the 3,247 cities, towns, villages, boroughs, and townships that received surveys, 1,559 responded (48.0%).
