Anoka County 800 Megahertz Public Safety Radio System

A successful collaboration between Anoka County and its municipal partners has led to the completion of a new 14-channel, 800 megahertz public safety radio system. This new system, which became operational in October 2005, has improved emergency communications between the county's 911 Central Communications Department and local police and fire departments. It has resulted in quicker response times and a greatly expanded channel capacity, up from 10 channels under the old system to 15 under the new system. Anoka County is only one of six counties in the state to install an 800 megahertz system.

The new public safety radio system was custom designed for Anoka County to seamlessly integrate into the regional public safety communications system currently in place in the Twin Cities metropolitan area. Successful completion of the project required close cooperation between the County and its municipal partners. For example, some city government buildings required updates in order to achieve optimal system operation. In addition, the County worked closely with cities when it became necessary to site radio towers in various communities.

The \$12.5 million project was financed in part by a \$2.5 million federal homeland security grant. The remainder was financed through a \$10 million bond issue authorized by the Minnesota Legislature as part of its homeland security program. New radios purchased as part of the system upgrade were programmed and distributed to all police

and fire departments in the County. The future replacement cost of the radios will be the responsibility of the individual communities.

The system has very successfully met its intended goals of improved coverage, increased capacity, and inter-operability for public safety radio users. The new system enhances Anoka County's capabilities in the event of a disaster or terrorist incident but also improves day to day public safety functions for all local police and fire departments in Anoka County.
