

development in such areas and which identifies overall program results.

Measure: By July 2010, Planning and Development will prepare a system for Board of Supervisors consideration to identify Brownfield locations in unincorporated Maricopa County, a system of shared information with other county departments on Brownfield redevelopment, and Brownfield redevelopment incentives for Board of Supervisors consideration and adoption. Once approved by the Board of Supervisors, Planning and Development will provide an annual report that measures progress in achieving compliance with the Board-adopted standards and identifies overall program results.

Each county agency and department will be responsible for monitoring and reporting their progress towards implementing the measures identified in this program. Therefore, each agency and department must determine how best to allocate staff resources to ensure timely and successful implementation.

Summary

The Green Government program demonstrates Maricopa County's commitment to a regional leadership role in promoting a healthier environment and enhanced quality of life. In addition, the program's "Lead by Example" approach is intended to demonstrate that Maricopa County is working to help achieve a sustainable environment, and to encourage Maricopa County citizens, businesses, and organizations to develop their own "Green" efforts. Maricopa County is excited about the results the Green Government program can achieve and the cooperative partnerships that will help contribute to a healthier and more sustainable future for Maricopa County.
